#### FAO – AU IBAR - key areas of collaboration



- An MOU is being finalised
- Animal production, fisheries, aquaculture, apiculture, animal feed, genetic resources and breed development
- Development and or updating policies, strategies and legislations to enhance investments and sustainable transformation of the livestock sectors
- Animal health system strengthening
- One Health implementation
- Continuous professional development of the public and private veterinary workforce
- Progressive control and eradication of high-impact animal diseases including zoonotic diseases
- Development and implementation of AMR action plans and mitigation of AMR

# **Key FAO collaborative actions in 2024**



- Stocktaking of LiDesa and formulation of an M&E framework
  - High-level engagement in the 33rd FAO Africa Regional Conference 2024
- Joint development of the country report questionnaires on animal genetics and sharing recent developments in DAD-IS
- ECOWAS regional animal feed sector strategy
- FMD control in West Africa, animal mobility and risk mapping, socio-economic impact studies, PCP support officers for the development of national control plans, and lab capacity strengthening
- ECOWAS Regional HPAI control strategy
- Joint AU-IBAR/FAO/WOAH meeting of CVOs: Sustainable Livestock Transformation and Validation of the Regional Strategy for the Control of African Swine Fever (ASF), and 3 national ASF action plans
- Joint AMR mitigation actions and the celebration of the World AMR Awareness Week 2024
- Joint submission of the PF project; though it was unsuccessful this time.


## **Key FAO collaborative actions in 2024**



- High-level engagement in the 33rd FAO Africa Regional Conference 2024 with resolution on PPR
- EU-funded continental PPR eradication project, the agreement signed in November 2024.
  - Jointly organised the first and second Inter-REC PPR coordination meetings, the launching of ecosystem guidelines, and the roadmap for West Africa.
  - Jointly with IAEA and AU-PANVAC, supporting the strengthening of regional and national laboratories in Africa (Nigeria, Tanzania and Tunisia).
  - Supported Eritrea, Rwanda and Tanzania with 10M doses of PPR vaccines
  - Continued joint efforts for PPR resource mobilisation
  - Assistance for PPR dossier formulation for never-PPR-reported countries.
  - LICS supported IBAR in submitting a concept note for the African Development Bank: Enhancing Trade in Livestock and Livestock Products Amid PPR and Other Priority Trade Sensitive Disease Threats in Africa through Improved Coordination and Spatial Analysis.





## **Strengthening Global Security in Africa (2014-23)**

## **Key FAO collaborative actions in 2025**



- African Regional Forum on Sustainable Livestock Sector Transformation, and One Health in the Agrifood Systems
  - AU-IBAR's convening power
  - Joint organising committee & transformative agenda
  - Joint selection and development of 3-4 knowledge production on transformative topics
  - FAO will soon return with a concept note
- Supporting the AU-IBAR's regional continental rabies elimination strategy
- Emergency response to African Swine Fever outbreaks and preparedness in three African countries
  - AU-IBAR/FAO regional workshop for coordination mechanism, partnership and advocacy for resource mobilization to implement the regional control strategy
  - Joint AU-IBAR/FAO support to border control measures and informal cross-border transit and trade of pigs and pig products leading to the spread of ASF

# **Priority works planned for 2025**



- Biosecurity for resilient value chains and prevention and control of priority transboundary and zoonotic diseases in Africa
  - Regional FMD control strategies for EA and WA
  - PMP-TAB scale up in priority value chains for improved productivity, safe food and market access.
- Regional meetings to discuss data integration and interoperability for enhanced information sharing across sectors, early detection and improved analytics for decision support
  - Partner with AU-IBAR on One Health data alliance,
  - Data codification harmonization across Africa
- Support AU-IBAR in strengthening Data Management Infrastructure and Enhanced Capacity for Programming and Project Monitoring across AU-IBAR, RECs, and Key Partners- through the support from FAO Livestock Interventions Coordination System (LICS)
- Strengthening animal health workforce capacities (ISAVET, VLCs and others)


# **Priority works planned for 2025**



- Continue strengthening One Health systems in the region
  - Animal health system strengthening efforts and OH implementation through various projects (GHSP, PF, DTRA, Fleming Fund, for example)
  - Joint endeavours to seek resources for financing the project "Strengthening Pandemic Prevention, Preparedness and Response along transhumance corridors in Africa"
  - Joint AMR activities, including RENOFARM INFARM scaling up
- Joint efforts through the PanAfrican PPR Secretariat to achieve the goal of PPR eradication in Africa by 2030
- Animal genetic resources/breed development
  - To improve the regional capacity in the management of animal genetic resources
  - Joint AU-IBAR/FAO support to four countries on data collection and sharing into DAD-IS.
  - Strengthen institutional capacities in the selected for scaling-up data collection and management
